# KIDTOWN GUIDE Preschool

DATE: 3/21/21 SCRIPTURE: Hebrews 1-8 LESSON: Hall of faith

### INTRO

**Say -** Today we are going to remember some people in the Bible who had faith. Faith is when we believe in something even though we can't see it.

**Act on Faith -** Ask children what they would do in the following scenarios. Guide children to play out their response. Use the scenarios provided or create your own scenarios that require faith. Example: There's a wild lion on the loose! (run and hide) There's a parade outside our window! (go look) There are cupcakes at the table! (sit at the table) There's a gift for you under the chair! (go to the chair)

**Say -** We were just pretending together, but when you trust that someone loves you and is telling the truth, you do what they say! God loves us and always tells the truth, so we can trust Him and do what He says.That's faith! Listen to today's Bible story to learn more about faith.



### **LESSON - HALL OF FAITH**

### Story Point #1: (Kids repeat!)

#### God is pleased when we have faith! (Kids Repeat!)

There were many many people in the Bible who had faith! Faith is when you believe in something you can't see. Think about the wind outside on a very windy day. You can't see it, but you know it's there! You can see what the wind does and you can feel it, right? Even though we can't see God in person, we trust and believe in Him. Think about Noah. Could he see the rain God said He would send? No, not yet! But Noah trusted in God and had faith to build that ark. When the rain came, Noah must have been so happy that He put His faith in God! When we trust in Him, we are showing Him how much we love him. What can you trust God for today?

#### Christ Connection! (Kids repeat!) Jesus gives us faith! (Kids repeat!)

It can be difficult to have faith when we can't see God or what He is doing! We can see throughout the Bible and even in our own lives that God always keeps His promises. We never have to worry that God won't come through for us. He promised to send Jesus, to be our Rescuer. Because of Jesus - we can have faith, always knowing that God will take care of us.



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### RESPONSE

- Sing: <u>Rejoice Be Glad</u> (Key Passage Song) <u>Psalm 40:5</u>
- **Pray:** Dear God, thank you for giving us all of these examples of people who had faith in you! Help us to have faith even when it is difficult. Amen.

#### **Discuss:**

- What does it mean to have faith? (Believing when we can't see something)
  - Can you remember one person from the Bible who had faith? (Noah, Moses...)
- Is it hard for you to have faith? Why?
  - Allow time for questions and if you don't know the answers, that's okay. Affirm their question and let them know that you don't know but will try to find out.

### **BONUS ACTIVITIES**

**Coloring Sheet -**<u>Printable Coloring Sheet</u> of the heroes of faith.

**Trust Falls -** Practice some trust falls with kids. Have them stand in front of you and fall back into your arms. After you have practiced a few times, ask your kids if they trust when they fall back you will catch them.

**Say -** Today we are going to learn about faith. Hebrews 11:1 gives us our definition of faith as being "sure of what we hope for and certain of what we do not see." You still had faith in me to catch you even when you couldn't see.
