One Big Thing:

God is always at work to make things right again.

Review:

This week, we read the story of Jesus and Thomas from John 20:19-31. We said that often we are called to have faith in God even when we don't see or feel Him working.

Challenge:

Spend time reading and thinking about Scripture each day in order to grow our faith in God.

This section of our series is focused on putting our faith in God. We are defining faith as complete trust in something or someone. You may need to help your child read the story each day and answer the questions.

Day 1:

Read John 20:19-31. How do you think Thomas felt when the other disciples told him they had seen Jesus? Write or draw something showing how you would feel.

Day 2:

Read John 20:19-31. What did Thomas say he would need to see and touch before he would believe that Jesus had risen from the dead? Write or draw how you think Jesus' hands looked.

Day 3:

Read John 20:19-31. When Jesus appeared to Thomas, how do you think Thomas felt? Write or draw something showing how you would feel.

Day 4:

Read John 20:19-31. When Jesus appeared to Thomas, what did Jesus say? Write or draw how you would react if Jesus appeared to you.

Day 5:

Read John 20:19-31. If you can, write out the second part of verse 29 beginning with "Blessed...". Pray that God would help you believe in Him even when you can't see Him.
