



He is Eternal & Immutable | Week 4

1. Catch Up On Life:

This is when we update each other on the things that Jesus has been up to in our lives since we last saw each other. As church family, we care about each other's lives: what we're celebrating, what we're mourning, what decisions we are praying through, and everything in between. (1 Thessalonians 2:8, Romans 12:10 and 15)

- Celebrate the wins - where have you seen Jesus working in the last week (shaping you to be more like Himself or working in the lives of those that He's put around you)?
- What (if any) big life updates do you need to catch us up on (positive or negative)?

Pray: Take every opportunity to pray and thank God for the good He's doing in our lives, and ask for help and healing anywhere there is pain.

2. Review the Mission:

Just like God the Father sent Jesus on a mission of reconciliation for us, Jesus sends us out as ambassadors of His reconciliation. We are called to make disciples wherever we go. (John 20:21 and 2 Corinthians 5:18-20)

People:

- Reactive - Who in your life (family, coworkers, etc.) can we join you in praying for? Who has God put around you that is showing spiritual interest? Who is hurting and could use some love from our group?
- Proactive - Who are the people we are intentionally living on mission with (neighbors, STC partner organizations, or a specific demographic in Columbia)? What are our upcoming plans to love, serve, and build relationships with this group?

Plan:

- Are there any rhythms already planned, or an extra rhythm we could plan to create a way for these friends to connect with our group?

Pray: Prayer is the fuel of God's mission. Let's pray for our people by name; pray for their needs, and opportunities to have spiritual conversations that help them take next steps toward Jesus.

3. Sermon Discussion:

God uses His Word to reveal Himself to us, equip us to live the good life He's designed for us, show us our sin, and strengthen us as we follow Him. We preach the Word on Sundays and apply it as a LifeGroup throughout the week. (2 Timothy 3:16-17, Colossians 1:9-12 and James 1:22-25)

Primary Passage: Psalm 102

Read **Psalm 102** out loud. Spend some time silently reflecting and journaling the following questions as a LifeGroup. What stands out from the passage? What does this passage reveal to us about God? What does this passage reveal to us about people? **Share with one another what you thought, reflected, and wrote about.**

What stood out overall from the sermon?

In the sermon we quoted A.W. Tozer who said, "What peace it brings to the Christian's heart to realize that our Heavenly Father never differs from himself. In coming to him at any time we need not wonder whether we shall find him in a receptive mood."

How does this reality encourage you in the way you approach and interact with God?

How does God's attributes of eternality (always has been and always will be) and immutability (never changes) encourage you? How do they challenge or convict you?

Spend some time praying through these Scriptures:

Read **Psalm 102:12** and **Psalm 90:1-2** out loud.

Pray that our awareness of God's eternality would lead us to deeper trust in Him.

Read **Psalm 102:24-27** out loud.

Pray that our awareness of God's immutability (unchangingness) and our constant changing would lead us to great worship and reverence of Him.

Read **Psalm 102:28** and **Hebrews 13:8** out loud.

Praise God that He never changes and is the same forever and that means we can rest and find security in Him.

4. Engage the Heart:

Jesus calls us to walk in the light, confessing our sins to God and each other. God's Spirit works through confession and community to lead us to repentance. (Romans 3:23-24, James 5:16 and 1 John 1:5-10)

- What are you struggling to trust God with this week? How can you give God control of it?
- Has the Holy Spirit been prompting you to do anything that you've been resisting? What steps do you need to take to obey?

Pray: James tells us that a community that regularly confesses sin and prays for each other will see a lot of healing. Confess your sins in prayer and pray for each other.
